## **APPLICATION FOR TRAVEL DOCUMENT**

To apply for a Travel Document, applicants are requested to forward to the Mauritius High Commission the duly filled-in "*Application for a Mauritius Passport*" Form (P.F.136) <u>http://passport.gov.mu/English//DOCUMENTS/PF%20136NEW2013.PDF</u>.

- 2. The following should be submitted along with the application form:
  - i. Money Order/Cheque for <u>AU\$ 26.00</u> drawn in favour the Mauritius High Commission
  - ii. Letter stating reason/s for application for a Travel Document
- iii. 2 identical passport sized photographs
- iv. blank registered post envelope
- 3. The applicant is also required to submit certified true copies of the following:
- (a) Birth Certificate
- (b) Marriage/Divorce Certificate (if applicable)
- (c) Passport, (Pages 1-5) (if applicable)
- (e) National Identity Card of Mauritius
- (f) Residency Status in Australia- visa/Certificate of Citizenship
- (g) Naturalisation/Registration Certificate (where applicable)
- (h) Statutory Declaration from the Police for Lost Property (for lost passport)
- (i) Proposed travel itinerary
- 4. Application for a Travel Document for <u>Minors</u> should <u>also</u> be accompanied by:
- (a) Birth Certificate (of applicant and of parents)
- (b) Marriage/Divorce Certificate (of parents).
- (c) Letter of Consent from both parents in case of minors. Consent of parents may be obtained/certified either before a Police Officer in a Police Station, at the Mauritius High Commission or at the office of a Legal Authority with the name of the officer clearly written and with an official seal affixed thereon.
- (d) Passport, (Pages 1-5) (if applicable and those of parents)
- (e) National Identity Card of Mauritius (of parents, if any)
- (f) Residency Status in Australia- visa/Certificate of Citizenship (of parents)
- (g) Naturalisation/Registration Certificate (where applicable)
- (h) Statutory Declaration from the Police for Lost Property (for lost passport)
- (i) Proposed travel itinerary

<u>The applicant is required to call in person at the Mauritius High Commission to collect the</u> <u>Travel Document</u>. The attention of applicants is drawn to the Sixth Schedule (Regulation 21) of the Passport Regulation 1969, the issuing authority of a Travel Document should certify that the photograph and signature on the Travel Document are those of the bearer, that is, <u>the applicant should be physically present before the issuing authority at the</u> <u>Mauritius High Commission in Canberra.</u>
